


### **RESOURCE CLOSETS**

Five Star Resource Closets provide Adams 12 students and families with zero-barrier access to essential resources ensuring ALL students are learning-ready. The goal of the Resource Closets is to empower Adams 12 K-12 students (and their families) to become learning-ready by receiving immediate, real-time basic needs and resources (including warmth, stability, and nutrition), ensuring they have access to essentials to thrive. When students have their needs met, we see an increase in attendance, increased learning and social-emotional development, and the ability to be an active classroom participant. Students have access to caring adults fostering trust and security allowing students to be a part of a community. In 2023, the Five Star Education Foundation invested over \$753,000 in 40 Resource Closet locations and had 154,943 points of contact within the community.

One student needed bus passes to get to school. She is a good student, but we noticed an issue in attendance. When I offered her a bus pass from our Resource Closet, she was so happy and has had near-perfect attendance and has been able to get to work on time! She is also made it on our graduation list to finish this year!

Many of our students walk to school, often 2+ miles each way, and with the weather getting colder, they do not have the appropriate outerwear for a long, cold walk. We've also recently had several students join us who have migrated to the US from Honduras, Nicaragua, Venezuela, and Mexico with very little in their possession - especially heavy coats, because of the climate in their country of origin. We have already outfitted a number of them with new, warm jackets to brave their cold morning walks to school!





### **LEARNING READINESS**

City of Northglenn invests in the Five Star Education Foundation for Adams 12 newcomer students providing access to \$30,000 to use at the Northglenn Parks and Recreation Centers throughout the city to welcome families, engage physical fitness, create friendships, and grow a community. In our growing partnership with the Adams 12 Student and Family Outreach Program, the Foundation is strengthening our understanding of outside barriers, the power in our community nonprofit partners, and is dedicated to ALL means ALL for our students.



### THE YES FUND

Investing in student success also means investing in our educators. The YES Fund supports teachers to help them utilize unique learning and growth opportunities. In 2023, the Foundation funded 42 inspiring applications for learning readiness and career readiness programs. Programs ranged from the math to music departments and supported new school supplies in classrooms.

### **DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION SUPPORT**

Representation matters, and when students read stories with characters who look like them succeed, it has a positive impact on the student. In spring of 2023, the Foundation added thousands of books to our schools' libraries. **The Five Star Education Foundation invested in new books so that schools can support the growth of their diverse, inclusive and representative library collections.** This gift grows the reading relevancy and representation with up-to-date titles.

Additionally, from the Foundation's strong belief in ALL means ALL, the Foundation invested \$28,000 for professional development and community outreach skills building for a select group of Adams 12 employees. Through the power of partnership, the Foundation provided the Diversity, Equity and Inclusion team with the funds for bias-training to school counselors.



### **REPRESENTATION MATTERS**

BIPOC and female students are grossly underrepresented in the fields of Engineering and Computer Science. These students experience more obstacles to enrollment and participation in these cutting-edge programs. To mind this gap, the Foundation and FutureForward at Bollman launched a new mentorship program called *I See Me* in which students enrolled in Engineering and Computer Science programs are paired with a college mentor that looks and identifies as the high school student. Throughout the year students connect with industry professionals, develop self-efficacy, explore career options, and discuss and challenge their perceptions of themselves in the field. Students of the program toured Lockheed Martin, Xcel Energy, College of Mines, University of Colorado Boulder, and University of Denver.

The Foundation's investment since its start of over \$125,000 to ensure that students have role models, mentors, and career support. In the first year, <u>100% of the students</u> went on to higher education in STEM, went directly into the STEM field, or enrolled in their second year of the program.

"Our college tours reviewed the whole campus and did a deep dive into the whole engineering department at Colorado State University. We saw the labs and all the different machines students learned how to use. The tours got me excited about going to college!"


# **FUTUREFORWARD SUPPORT**

In 2023, the Foundation continued to champion career programs of Adams 12 Five Star Schools' FutureForward Career and Technical Education. Investments range from real-life industry tools, real-life props, and more hands-on in classroom items to give our students as much exposure to real-world careers. Because of our industry and city partners, we are able to take learning beyond the classroom with tours, guest speakers, and direct program support to hire our workers of tomorrow.

The Foundation concentrated on student engagement activities, including hosting a Teacher Cadet mentorship dinner where former Broncos player Dymonte Thomas shared how his teachers significantly influenced his life and career. Additionally, the Foundation organized an event for a group of girls to attend a Women in Construction luncheon at Murphy Construction Company, aiming to introduce non-traditional students to the construction industry.

## **BUILDING HOMES FOR THE UNHOUSED IN ADAMS COUNTY**

The Five Star Education Foundation supports the Adams 12 Five Star Schools FutureForward at Washington Square construction program for the next 4 years to build tiny houses for those unhoused. We also partner with local businesses to donate materials and supplies. The students in this program experience real-life skills training while benefiting the Five Star Community. These tiny houses are placed in a village supporting young adults who are experiencing homelessness. As of Fall 2023, the students have started their third house. This project is a top recruiting tool for non-traditional students in the program.







The Five Star Education Foundation supports Adams 12 students by removing barriers to success and providing pathways in life and in a strong community. 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

### **2023 COVID RECOVERY CONTINUES**

#### American Rescue Plan Act Impact 2023

This Adams County grant provided \$481,033 for Adams 12 COVID-19 Response and Health & Wellness Team to provide eight health aides in our local schools, and two critical family outreach positions for two years to help our most vulnerable students. To date, this team supported **356 families** access resources in critical situations.



The Adams 12 Student and Family Outreach Program (SFOP) exists to remove barriers that keep students from being engaged and thriving in school by providing access to community resources and health insurance. We believe that all students hold the strength and potential to thrive and that healthy students have improved learning outcomes, attendance, and behavior. The Adams 12 SFOP is made up of staff members who specialize in Homeless Education, Child Welfare Education, Migrant Education, and Evacuee/Refugee Education.

Adams 12 Newcomer Summer Camp provides academic and social-emotional support to students who are underperforming due to residual effects of COVID closures. This program results in increased test scores and provides a rich learning environment to students for whom English is their second language.


> Our only Chinese-speaking student started the program sitting by himself, but he made friends and  $m{ au}$ communicated with other students, and by the end, he was playing with several students and seemed so comfortable!

The grant also provided \$180,570 for a Mental Health and Wellness Coordinator for two years to support struggling teachers and other staff. The Wellness Coordinator provided emergency crisis support to three sites and supported over 120 teacher and staff referrals from 2022 to 2023.

Thank you for rushing in to provide much-needed support to the SRMS community immediately after we lost a student. It helped immensely to have counselors and mental health support on hand to help staff and students navigate a truly miserable experience. Because of your support, our counseling and admin staff were able to both grieve and provide support to our community in other ways. I will forever be grateful for your help and support.

### **2023 CAPACITY BUILDING**

In addition to the ongoing ARPA grant, the Five Star Education Foundation dedicated the bulk of its grant writing resources toward our core mission programs. We continue our significant investments into 40 Resource Closets that are meeting the immediate needs of our students and their families. The Foundation was awarded \$353,557.50 in grant dollars dedicated to career readiness, learning readiness, diversity and inclusion, and capacity building for Adams 12 Five Star Schools. We also consulted on major cross-department grants for the district.

The Five Star Education Foundation was awarded \$3.2 million through the American Rescue Act Plan to be spent between 2022-2024.


